ERUK Annual Grant Round 2020

Opens soon (May 2020 according to website) **Pilot studies**

Up to £30,000 across 2 years. Awarded to a research team to test a novel research idea and provide evidence to leverage larger funding amounts.

Project Grants

Up to £200,000 across 3 years. Awarded to a team with a track record in epilepsy research to investigate a research question based on prior evidence.

Fellowship Award

Up to £300,000 across 4 years. Awarded to an early career researcher to develop their skills and knowledge in order to become a leader in epilepsy research.



HEE's Innovation Voucher Competition

Deadline: 13 July 2020

Open to all NHS staff the competition supports the development of novel medical technologies. Entries are limited to those supporting the development of **physical devices**. Ideas that include software as a feature are eligible, but ideas that are solely software based are excluded.

This competition is sponsored by eg technology ltd who will work with the winners to develop and progress innovative ideas through activities such as:

- Ideation workshop
- Design review
- **URS and PSR development**
