Public health intervention development

Apply for funding to develop an intervention addressing a UK or global public health issue. You can apply for up to £150,000. MRC will fund:

- UK research organisations at 80% full economic cost
- overseas costs at 100% full economic cost.

Your project will be funded for up to 18 months.

PHIND proposals can include qualitative and quantitative primary research and the development of theory and logic models. However, emphasis should be placed on developing the intervention.

The bursary is open to paediatric trainees and newly qualified consultants wishing to undertake an epidemiological research study into a rare disease or condition that affects children, and which addresses a question of clinical or public health importance
